<b>taste</b>	<i>The pie <b>tasted</b> delicious.</i>	<b>know</b>	<i>I know that <b>voice!</b></i>
<b>smell</b>	<i>I <b>smelled</b> something burning and immediately turned off the stove.</i>	<b>grasp</b>	<i>He <b>grasped</b> the concept quickly.</i>
<b>feel</b>	<i>She <b>felt</b> a sense of accomplishment after finishing the marathon.</i>	<b>pick up on</b>	<i>She was able to <b>pick up on</b> the subtle changes in his tone of voice.</i>
